Schedule 'C'

Transfer Station Policies and Procedures

Transfer Station Tipping Fees

1. Purpose:

1.1) To provide a unilateral pricing index to all the ratepayers and users of the transfer station.

2. Definitions:

- 2.1) **Compost**: aerobically decomposed remnants of organic matter. It is used in landscaping, horticulture and agriculture as a soil conditioner and fertilizer. It is also used for erosion control, land and stream reclamation, wetland construction, and as landfill cover.
- 2.2) *E-waste*: electronic equipment that is being recycled through Sarcan Depots throughout the province of Saskatchewan. Items include: desktop and notebook computers, monitors, desktop printers and televisions.
- 2.3) *Freon*: Du Pont's trade name for its odorless, colorless, nonflammable, and noncorrosive chlorofluorocarbon and hydrochlorofluorocarbon refrigerants, which are used in air conditioning and refrigeration systems.
- 2.4) Hazardous Substance: any substance designated in Section 3 of "The Hazardous Substances and Waste Dangerous Goods Regulations". Means a substance that because of its quantity, concentration or physical, chemical or infectious characteristics, either individually or in combination with other substances, is an existing or potential threat to the environment or human health.
- 2.5) Hazardous Waste: means a waste that because of its quantity, concentration or physical, chemical or infectious characteristics, either individually or in combination with other wastes, is an existing or potential threat to the environment or human health and is designated in the regulations as a hazardous waste.
- 2.6) Liquid Domestic Waste: liquid domestic sewage-means any remains or byproducts which contain animal, mineral or vegetable matter in solution or suspension.
- 2.7) Offal: the rejected or waste parts of a butchered animal.
- 2.8) **Sumpage**: the sludge that accumulates in pits, interceptors and tanks from car washes, garages, etc.

4. Composting

- 4.1) Grass clippings, leaves, etc. are composted on-site, then made available to residents free-of-charge; compost is to be maintained in a neat and orderly manner, according to composting rules.
- 4.2) No tipping fee will be charged.

5. Clean Wood and Trees:

- 5.1) Clean wood and trees may be burnt at the transfer stations provided this is done in accordance with the following conditions:
 - a) clean wood shall be separated from other types of refuse at the transfer station;
 - b) prior to burning, the person in charge of the burn, must inspect the pile and/or pit to ensure that it contains only clean wood waste;



- c) the person in charge of the burn must ensure that all plastic, rubber, metal, painted or treated wood and all other materials that are not clean wood waste are removed from the pile and/or put prior to burning;
- d) burning shall be conducted on a day when wind speeds are less than 20 mph, and smoke will not be a nuisance to the occupants of the nearest residences;
- e) the fire shall be supervised at all times by qualified personnel;
- f) fire suppression equipment shall be at the transfer station or on standby;
- g) the person in charge of the burn shall immediately cease burning and suppress the fire if the fire has caused or is causing 'air pollution' as defined by the Clean Air Act; and
- h) the person in charge of the burn shall abide by The Prairie Forest Fire Act, 1982 where applicable.
- 5.2) In the event of an unauthorized fire: the Approval Holder must take immediate action to extinguish the fire. The Approval Holder must notify Saskatchewan Environment as soon as possible of the fire and submit a written or verbal report to the department within 48 hours following the incident. The report shall include the cause and the steps that were taken to mitigate the occurrence. The report shall also include any recommendations that will be implemented to ensure that burning will not occur again.

6. Transfer Station Hours of Operation

- 6.1) The hours of operation for the transfer station shall be:
 - a) Summer hours beginning the first Wednesday after May 1st Wednesday 11 am to 7 pm Saturday 9 am to 1 pm
 - b) Winter hours begin on the Saturday of the September long weekend Wednesday 9 am to 5 pm Saturday 9 am to 1 pm
- 6.2) The transfer station will not be open when the temperature outside is less than -30°C.

7. Transfer Station Revenue:

- 7.1) Transfer station revenue shall be submitted the month that it is received, if the last day of the month is a day which the transfer station is open then the revenues shall be submitted to the Municipal Office on the first working day after.
- 7.2) A copy of the Waste Drop-off Recording Sheet must also be submitted monthly to the Municipal Office. A copy of the Waste Drop-off Recording Sheet is attached as Schedule "B".
- 7.3) Receipts will not be issued at the transfer station. All receipts will be issued at the beginning of the month for the previous months tipping through the Municipal Office in Neilburg and mailed. Due to administration costs receipts will not be issued for fees less than \$10.00.
